## Fr. Seeley's Corner

Jesus came to earth to conquer by sweetness, by love.

Now this may sound corny, like a bad Hallmark card, but you have to understand that not all sweetness is the same, nor is all love the same. To love someone you have to wish good for them. This might mean disciplining them when they act wrongly or make bad choices, and it might even mean making them mad.

When God sought to conquer the world, He did it by giving Himself for a sacrifice to redeem mankind and to reconcile mankind to God. This action invited mankind to an intimate relationship with God through Jesus Christ. So how does this conquer the world? By each soul entering into God and by the divine indwelling which means that God's love becomes our love. Thus, where conquering used to be accomplished by physically submitting one people to another, this conquering came when one people loves one another and seeks to do them good.


The people thus conquered by love, then seek to love back those who love them. This results in two groups of people who seek to help, love and serve the other. Jesus came to serve, not be served, so when a people follow Jesus Christ, they take it as a duty to love and serve their neighbor.

When people love something, they cherish it and beauty is the result. This beauty attracts, and soon others who do not know the love of God inquire about this beauty, and when they learn that it is the fruit of love of neighbor, and that these people wish them no harm but rather seek to love them, then are they attracted to this religion, and they join, and they become servants of their fellow man, and thus they are conquered.

So Jesus came to conquer. Not to physically subdue peoples under His reign, but to teach men to love their neighbor, and by loving their neighbor to conquer their hearts. So now we understand how Jesus conquered the hearts of people, that does not explain why he is, this night, born in a manger.

It may feel like a potato sack race, walking with Jesus, where we are constantly stumbling and tripping, and our walk may feel very one-sided with Jesus doing all of the work, and us creating all of the problems. But you know what it also means? That as we seek to love our neighbor, or neighbor will recognize that we who are fallen can make efforts to love and forgive our neighbor, then our neighbor will make those same efforts. Conquest!
